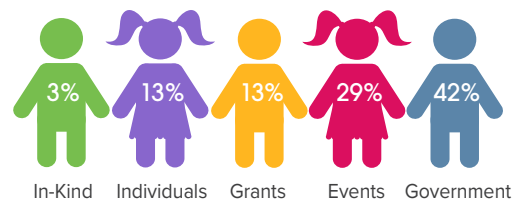

SOMETIMES FAMILY ISN'T BORN, IT'S FOUND!

"Sometimes family isn't born, it's found," said the quote on the adoption sign Mikyra's adoptive mom made for her special day. There has never been a truer statement! Mikyra's journey through foster care was long, spanning over a decade. She was only four when she was removed from her home. It took 13 placements for Mikyra and her adoptive family to finally find each other.



Since Mikyra came to us in 2014, we had the privilege and great responsibility of caring and advocating for her across all the programs in our service continuum. Mikyra resided at our residential treatment center for four years. Here, she received trauma-informed care, education and transition services. Her adoptive family participated in our family support services, which better prepared them for Mikyra's behavioral needs. Mikyra received services from her Wendy's Wonderful Kids' recruiter for over five years. Her recruiter was an additional supportive adult in her

life. The recruiter regularly visited her and, most importantly, provided support and expertise to her and her adoptive parents. For the last two years, Mikyra and her family received

case management services from the foster and adoption program; including treatment, coaching and crisis management. This additional layer of consistency and security helped Mikyra feel safe when times were difficult. Consistency,

connection, and best practices by a dedicated provider like Helping Hand Home made all the difference in Mikyra's path to healing and permanency.

In February of 2020, Mikyra was placed with her adoptive parents Jordan and Lindsay and their three adopted children. They welcomed her with open arms and hearts. It took some time, and there were bumps in the road, especially with COVID-19 and stay at home orders starting shortly after placement. Lindsay



and Jordan, however, handled each day with grace and love. Regardless how hard things got, they always made sure their message to Mikyra was the same: they loved her no matter what and she wasn't going anywhere. Slowly, Mikyra started to believe them and things got easier. On November 13th, 2020, friends and family gathered safely outdoors or over Zoom to celebrate the addition of this family's fourth child. The gavel banged and, in a year marked with uncertainty for many, 2020 finally brought Mikyra to solid ground: to find the loving, understanding and committed family she always deserved.
