FOSTER, ADOPTION, AND POST-ADOPT SERVICES

Provides high-quality, individualized care and trauma-informed support for children in foster care, from birth through age 21—guiding families from preparation to post-adoption to help them heal, grow, and thrive.

24-HOUR RESIDENTIAL AND THERAPEUTIC SERVICES

Provides 24-hour therapeutic care for children ages 4 – 13 facing emotional and behavioral challenges due to complex trauma, with a dedicated 2:1 child-to-staff ratio.

Since 2008, we have partnered with the University of Texas Charter School System to provide an on-site campus that meets the unique educational and behavioral needs of our children, helping them successfully transition to public school.

- 99% Average Daily Attendance






